Sovah Health Welcomes New Robot to Martinsville

*Innovative robotic technology transforms total knee
and total hip replacement procedures for local patients*



Many may be surprised to hear, but artificial intelligence (AI) is not new to Sovah Health. Robots and AI software have been advancing diagnoses and treatment plans for patients at both campuses for several years. Recently, the Martinsville campus was excited to welcome a new robot to its surgical team. Complementing the hospital's total joint program, the hospital's orthopedic robot, which arrived in late 2019, now assists Martinsville's orthopedic team with total knee and hip replacement surgeries. "It's exciting to be able to offer this transformative technology across the joint replacement service line

to perform total knee and hip replacements," said orthopedic/total joint surgeon Uosife Alfahd, MD, who leads the hospital's joint program and is trained in robotic-assisted joint replacement. "The new technology provides each of our patients with a personalized surgical experience based on their specific diagnosis and anatomy."

Though the robot is new to Sovah Health, the technology has been time-tested for over 13 years and over 200,000 procedures being performed to date. Naturally – with any new technology – patients are curious about joint replacement surgery and how the robot works.

What is joint replacement surgery?

Joint replacement surgery is a highly effective means of eliminating joint pain, restoring mobility and treating advanced arthritis. Total joint replacement is the surgical procedure in which parts of an arthritic or damaged joint and cartilage are removed and the bone is resurfaced with a metal, plastic or ceramic device called a prosthesis or implant. The prosthesis is designed to replicate the movement of a normal, healthy joint.

How does robotic-assisted joint replacement work?

1. Personalized surgical plan: Using software to create a 3D plan, the system tailors the techniques and performances to the patient's specific height, weight, and anatomical structure. It takes into account finer details that surgeons can't do with their eyes.
2. Range-of-motion assessment
3. Arthritic bone removal
4. Implant placement



Does the robot actually perform the surgery?

The robot is an advanced tool that the human uses for the surgery. The robot does not work independently during the operation. The surgeon controls and guides the robot within the predefined area across the patient's body. The arm is guided into the joint area to remove any affected bone mass or cartilage before inserting the replacement joint.

What are the benefits of robotic-assisted surgery?

- Smaller incisions
- Faster recovery
- Optimal implant placement for potentially more comfort
- Potentially reduced impact to surrounding tissue

About Sovah Health's Program

Launched in 2017, Sovah Health – Martinsville's total joint program, called Race to Relief, allows patients in our community the opportunity to receive best-in-class joint replacement without having to travel far from home. The program was developed to enhance patient outcomes through:

1. Comprehensive education and coordination in all phases of care
2. Consistent caregiver involvement and education
3. An enjoyable hospital experience
4. Faster recovery and return home

The program is led by orthopedic and total joint surgeon Uosife Alfahd, MD, FRSC. An expert in orthopedic trauma and limb reconstruction, Dr. Alfahd has more than 10 years of experience specializing in primary and revisional joint surgery, trauma surgery, partial knee replacement, knee arthroscopy and shoulder arthroplasty. Joint program coordinator Susanne Washburn, RN, RTR, works with Dr. Alfahd and a multi-disciplinary team from surgery, therapy, case management, dietary, pharmacy and nursing to ensure each patient achieves success through comprehensive education, clinical pathways, pain management and postoperative rehabilitation.

As a result, more than 350 local patients have graduated from the Race to Relief program and are back to enjoying their lives with more mobility and less pain.

The Harvest Foundation

Martinsville-Henry County is experiencing an era of vitality and renaissance. There are new industry announcements, new restaurants, new families joining the community, and unique educational opportunities to advance our workforce. The area is enjoying the lowest unemployment rates seen since 1990.

Community partners are collaborating more than ever together, and it's paying off.

The Harvest Foundation is building on this momentum with grant awards announced in its 2019 fall cycle. The Harvest Board of Directors announced eight grants totaling \$3.88 million. Each grant ties back to the foundation's strategic plan and goal of economic development to improve Martinsville-Henry County's overall health, educational opportunities, and quality of life.

"We had a wide range of diverse projects and programs that were under consideration for the fall grants cycle," said Allyson Rothrock, president of The Harvest Foundation. "Harvest's program staff spends a great deal of time working with these organizations throughout the year to ensure the strongest proposals are presented to the board of directors. We are excited to work with our partners and see how these organizations will positively impact our community in the coming months."

Grant awards were announced throughout December 2019 with a visual called the Harvest Grants Map, where #XMarkstheGrant. The visual is a map of Martinsville and Henry County highlighting notable landmarks and putting the spotlight on deserving grantees with projects and programs that will have a considerable impact on the community.

In the immediate future, Harvest is working to improve access to childcare and housing in Martinsville and Henry County. Committee work comprising partnerships with the County of Henry, the City of Martinsville, the Martinsville-Henry County Economic Development Corp., and many other local and regional partners, is underway. A housing summit with representatives from real estate, developers, lenders, and community officials was held in July 2019, followed by a childcare planning session in October. Work is expected to continue throughout 2020 to result in viable projects and programs.

Dick & Willie 6B - Section 6B of the Dick & Willie Passage Rail Trail opened to much fanfare in November of 2019. This 2.5-mile section of the trail runs from the Smith River Sports Complex to the Spruce Street Trailhead. The Harvest Foundation announced a recent grant of \$320,600 to finalize section 6A, a 2.96-mile section from the Spruce Street Trailhead to the existing trail at Mulberry Creek.

2019 #XMarkstheGrant Awards

Blue Ridge Regional Airport — \$863,000* to fund an environmental assessment and design services for the runway extension project.

Martinsville-Henry County Economic Development Corp. — \$176,140 to fund a one-year pilot Summer Internship Program.

Martinsville Community Recreation Association — \$407,770* to upgrade restroom and concession facilities at Hooker Field in Martinsville.

County of Henry — \$320,6000 over two years to complete section “6A” of the Dick & Willie Passage Rail Trail.

Dan River Basin Association — a \$700,000 challenge grant over five years with the potential to leverage \$7 million in funding to implement the 2019 Outdoor Recreation Master Plan for Rivers and Trails.

Henry County Furniture Museum — a one-year \$35,900 capital grant to continue improvements to the Bassett area that began with the Smith River Small Towns revitalization program.

West Piedmont Workforce Investment Board — \$1,079,727 over three years to pilot the Guided Career Exploration program to connect young adults to workforce training and jobs.

Virginia Legal Aid Society, Inc. — \$300,000 over three years to establish a local office providing legal and advocacy support for residents focusing on affordable and stable housing.

**Note: The Harvest Foundation will be paid back \$800,000 from the Blue Ridge Airport project and \$203,885 from the Martinsville Community Recreation Association Project at a later date through a program-related investment (PRI) funding opportunity.*

Learning Today, Leading Tomorrow

K-12 Education in Martinsville-Henry County



Martinsville City Public Schools

(Martinsville.K12.va.us)

Martinsville City Public Schools is an innovative school division that includes five schools serving preschool through 12th grade. With a mission of “Empowering Success One Learner At A Time”, MCPS uses project-based learning and business partnerships to bring relevant, real world learning into the classroom, preparing students for success in college and careers.

Points of distinction:

- Martinsville High School features state-of-the-art science labs, a TV studio, a mock hospital room, a robotics lab, an engineering makerspace, and an open commons area featuring collaborative work spaces.
- The **MCPS STEM** pipeline is a pre K – 12 initiative focused on developing the skills and interests of students in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) career pathways. There are three programs for each of our school levels:
 - We **ENspire** Interest (Pre K – 4th Grade)
 - We **ENgage** Learners (5th – 8th Grade)
 - We **ENgineer** the Future (9th – 12th Grade)
- Advanced learning is present throughout the school system with opportunities for middle school students to receive high school credits prior to the ninth grade and high school students to earn college credits, and associate’s degree and specialized certifications upon graduation.
- Martinsville City Schools are fully implementing AVID (Advancement via Individual Determination), a college and career readiness system. Using research-based strategies, teachers are able to increase the rigor of their instruction and enhance student reading, writing, organization, collaboration, and inquiry; the forefront of the AVID way and allowing students to meet the demand of a global society.
- Clearview Early Learning Center offers a full-day three and four year old preschool program, staffed by fully certified teachers.



Carlisle School

(CarlisleSchool.org)

Carlisle School is an independent, Pre K-12 school offering a college-preparatory curriculum that stresses hands-on, project-based learning with a variety of interdisciplinary projects to encourage students to apply their learning. Carlisle boasts impressive fine-arts offerings to students, including visual arts, choir, strings, band, and drama. Its impressive athletics program includes soccer, basketball, field hockey, tennis, golf, volleyball, baseball, cross country, and swimming, with recent state championship wins for its boys’ soccer and girls’ basketball team. Specialty clubs, such as photography, creative writing, community service, and design technology allow students to explore their interests. Carlisle also offers an International Program with students attending from countries including Australia, Brazil, China, Ecuador, Germany, India, Italy, Japan, Nigeria, and Spain.

Points of distinction:

- Carlisle is ranked the best independent K-12 school in Virginia with tuition under \$14,000 by Niche.com.
- Carlisle School has a 100% college acceptance rate since its first graduating class in 1974.
- The Class of 2019 received \$3.2 million in merit-based scholarships and received 114 acceptances into 72 schools



Henry County Public Schools

Henry County Public Schools (HCPS) provides its diverse community of learners with meaningful educational experiences that prepare them for a successful future. The division’s work to support student success has fostered a variety of opportunities for students to partner with community businesses and organizations, enriching the school community experience for all involved.

Points of distinction:

- HCPS is one of 114 school districts in the nation to be recognized as a member of the Digital Promise League of Innovative Schools. Member districts are recognized as those that promote lifelong learning and provide Americans with the knowledge and skills needed to compete in the global economy.
- HCPS is nationally recognized as a Green Ribbon School District and is home to two Green Ribbon Schools: Bassett High School and Magna Vista High School.
- HCPS is rich in technology with interactive boards or Apple TVs in every classroom and a student/device ratio of 1:1.
- HCPS is the first school district in Virginia to offer STEMformation in partnership with Discovery Education.
- HCPS’s Career Academy is preparing students to be workforce ready through its partnerships with local industry. In its first year, 90% of graduating seniors earned a state license or industry certificate.
- Magna Vista and Bassett High Schools are the homes of Virginia’s FIRST New Tech Network academies. Warrior Tech Academy at Magna Vista and Bengal Tech Academy at Bassett offer students a rigorous project-based curriculum of study and practice that are fun, engaging and expected for 21st century learners.

Continuing Your Education

Higher Learning in Martinsville-Henry County



Patrick Henry Community College (PatrickHenry.edu)

For over 50 years, Patrick Henry Community College (PHCC) has been the community's source for associate degrees, certificates, and workforce credentials, but that is only part of the story. PHCC doesn't just graduate students; it launches their journeys – whether that is to transfer to a four-year institution or to land a dream career.

By connecting students with potential employers through internships, interviews and more, PHCC helps graduates land careers. PHCC's many guaranteed transfer pathways help transfer students get started wherever their dreams take them. PHCC's alumni have excelled at places like Cornell University, Virginia Tech's School of Engineering and many more.

PHCC aims to help even more people start their educational journey and achieve their goals. A \$3.1 million donation from the Harvest Foundation enables more high school graduates to start their journeys than ever before. With the Harvest SEED Fund, every high school graduate from Martinsville and Henry County has the opportunity to attend PHCC completely free.

PHCC is also making college more accessible to the community by expanding their locations. In October 2017, PHCC opened the Manufacturing, Engineering, and Technology (MET) Complex, a 53,000 square foot facility filled with state-of-the-art equipment. In 2018, the college launched a renovation project to expand its offerings in Patrick County.

A third way PHCC is making college more accessible is by enabling students to start early. With a new dual enrollment program funded by the National Science Foundation, students can earn three-quarters of their engineering technology associate degree before graduating high school.

By adding locations, programs, and funding, PHCC is removing the barriers that keep the people it serves from getting the opportunities they deserve. By providing employee networking and transfer opportunities, PHCC ensures that from this community college, anyone can go anywhere.

New College Institute (NewCollegeInstitute.org)

New College Institute (NCI) makes quality higher-level education affordable and accessible to students of all ages in Southern Virginia. As a state agency, NCI partners with various state colleges and universities to provide degree, certificate/credential, and professional development opportunities in four strategic focus areas: 1) Advanced Manufacturing, 2) Technology & Cybersecurity, 3) Health & Human Services, and 4) Education & Community Leadership. NCI is committed to working with adults to better prepare them for the workforce and connect them to regional jobs.

In 2018, the average age of an NCI graduate was 31. NCI staff and faculty have proven success in their ability to develop academic programs while removing many barriers that exist for adult learners. This includes scheduling courses and using technology in order to best accommodate the busy lifestyles and responsibilities most adult students often have outside of their academic goals. Students take all courses in Martinsville, but in the end, their degrees come from the partner universities that hosts their specific programs.

In addition to degree and certification programs, NCI works closely with regional public education and industry partners to develop and enhance pipeline development opportunities in NCI's four areas of focus. Pipeline development includes non-credit lectures, educational camps, financial aid counseling, extensive internship opportunities and more. New College Institute's facilities are packed with state-of-the-art technology and equipment needed to meet the training and academic needs of students, faculty and local industry partners. Learning at NCI combines the best academia and hands-on learning opportunities to ensure our graduates and program completers are immediate contributors to our regional and statewide economy.

Other innovative programs offered at NCI include the Center of Advanced Manufacturing, and the Southside Telehealth Training Academy and Resource Center (STAR Telehealth).

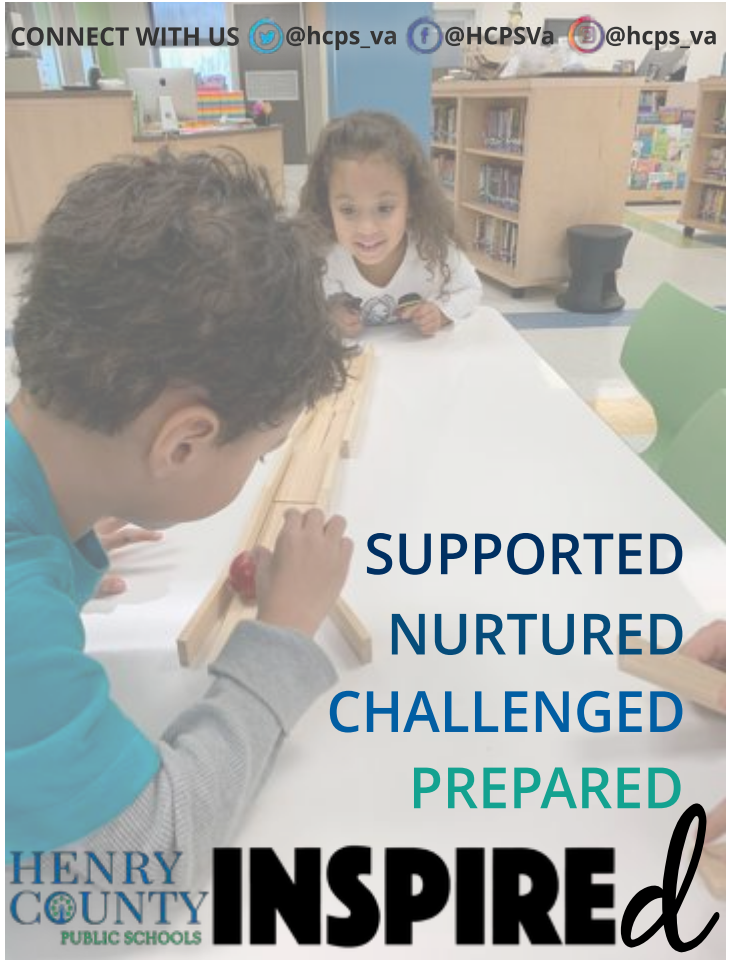

Vision of Growth

Blue Ridge Regional Airport

The vision of growth at Blue Ridge Airport quickly is becoming a reality with several exciting announcements throughout 2019 that put planned improvements at the airport on the fast track.

U.S. Senators Mark R. Warner and Tim Kaine announced a \$7 million grant award to Blue Ridge Airport in November 2019 from the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Airport Improvement Program, which provides grants for the planning and development of public-use airports that are significant to national air transportation. This funding will go toward the airport's major project to expand the runway from 5,002 feet to 6,000 feet.

A 6,000-foot runway at Blue Ridge Airport:


- Makes the window to the community much bigger;
- Separates Martinsville-Henry County from other communities;
- Is safer and more optimal for large aircraft; and
- Is a game-changer for economic development efforts.

A grant announcement from The Harvest Foundation totaling \$863,000, with \$800,000 of that funding being paid back to the foundation at a later date through a program-related investment, puts the runway expansion project on an accelerated timeline. The airport will not have to wait for federal funding to complete required preliminary work, such as the environmental assessment and design. It moves up the process potentially avoiding a six-year delay.

"With the Harvest grant, this moves the runway project to a shovel-ready position, improving its position to compete for federal and state funding," said Jason Davis, manager for Blue Ridge Airport. "Our community seeks to be a complete package to the world around us, offering an exceptional place to live, work and play. Blue Ridge Airport is a critical component of the southwest region's transportation infrastructure, serving business and tourism along with a multitude of other facets."

Davis said Blue Ridge Airport loses out on 539 operations per year by large-cabin class business aircraft to regional airports because of the short runway. He estimates that they'll be able to accommodate 776 aircraft operations per year by large-cabin class business aircraft once the runway extension is complete. Davis said over the next 20 years, that number could grow to 1,276 aircraft operations.

Around 38 percent of business aviation missions involve multiple destinations, and 55 percent of companies using business aviation have more than 500 employees, according to figures provided by Davis. The airport contributes \$9.72 million annually in total economic impact to the region, according to the Virginia Airport System Economic Impact Study. Davis said this number could increase by 50 percent with activity generated from the runway extension.

"The runway extension is an important infrastructure investment that can be marketed to future employers and provide direct access into the Martinsville-Henry County area from locations around the globe," Davis added. "With this extension, the sky truly is the limit."

Ready For A Historic Year in 2020

Martinsville Speedway

While the list of historic events at Martinsville Speedway is already long enough to write a book about, the 2020 season is already anticipated to be one to remember.

The lists of events that has put Martinsville Speedway on the map is well documented.

From holding the honor of being the only track in NASCAR to host at least one race in the top level of NASCAR racing every year since the organization's inception to featuring The Traditional Martinsville Speedway Hot Dog™, there are many reasons to hold the Virginia landmark in high regard.

Now there are a few more new events to add to the resume for the shortest track to host NASCAR Cup Series racing.

For the first time in the 73-year history of the facility, the NASCAR Cup Series will compete under the lights this spring. It will also host the event in May for the first time since 1970 when the late NASCAR Hall of Famer Bobby Isaac won the Virginia 500 on May 31st.

"This is a very exciting day for Martinsville Speedway," Speedway President Clay Campbell said. "It's a question we've gotten from fans literally every day since we installed the lights and we are now able to say, 'May 9, 2020.' So, this is a very exciting day for everyone involved."

Martinsville Speedway is known for its action-packed races with exciting finishes and the visual should only be improved as fans will watch the best stock-car drivers in the world battle for 500 laps around the .526-mile track under the lights.

The Speedway installed a state-of-the-art LED Lighting system in 2017, becoming the first major motorsports facility in the United States to do so.

Joining the NASCAR Cup Series cars in May will be the oldest division in NASCAR – the Whelen Modified Tour with the MaxPro Window Films 200.

The ground pounders return to Martinsville Speedway for the first time since 2010 and Campbell adds fans are about as excited to see them return as they are for the night race for the

Cup Series.

“We get asked a lot about the modifieds a lot – from fans, from drivers, from media,” Campbell said. “Now, we can say, ‘Yes, we will have them back next year.’ These cars are such an important part of Martinsville Speedway history and the time is right to bring them back.”

Also new on the schedule in 2020 will be the significance of the Fall NASCAR Cup Series race weekend.

When the NASCAR Cup Series returns for its second date at Martinsville Speedway it will be to host the elimination race to determine who will compete in the Championship 4 the following weekend.

Eight drivers will enter the weekend with only four becoming eligible to compete for the 2020 championship in not only the NASCAR Cup Series, but also in the NASCAR Xfinity Series and the NASCAR Gander RV & Outdoors Truck Series.

“We’re moving to one of the most important races on the schedule, setting up the Cup Series finale,” Campbell added. “Recent history has shown us that drivers will do whatever it takes to secure a spot in the Championship Race, and now the urgency and intensity will go to another level, as it’s the last shot for teams to have a chance at the championship.

“We’ve seen so much excitement and intensity unfold being the first race in the Round of 8, so moving to the last race of that round, the last chance the Playoff drivers have of securing a spot in the Championship Race, I expect that to ratchet up even higher,” Campbell said. “I think drivers have proven they will do whatever it takes to move on, and Martinsville lends itself to beating and banging you don’t get anywhere else.”

Martinsville was a regular stop for the Xfinity Series schedule from the series’ inception in 1982 through the 1994 season and it held a one off race in 2006, won by Kevin Harvick.

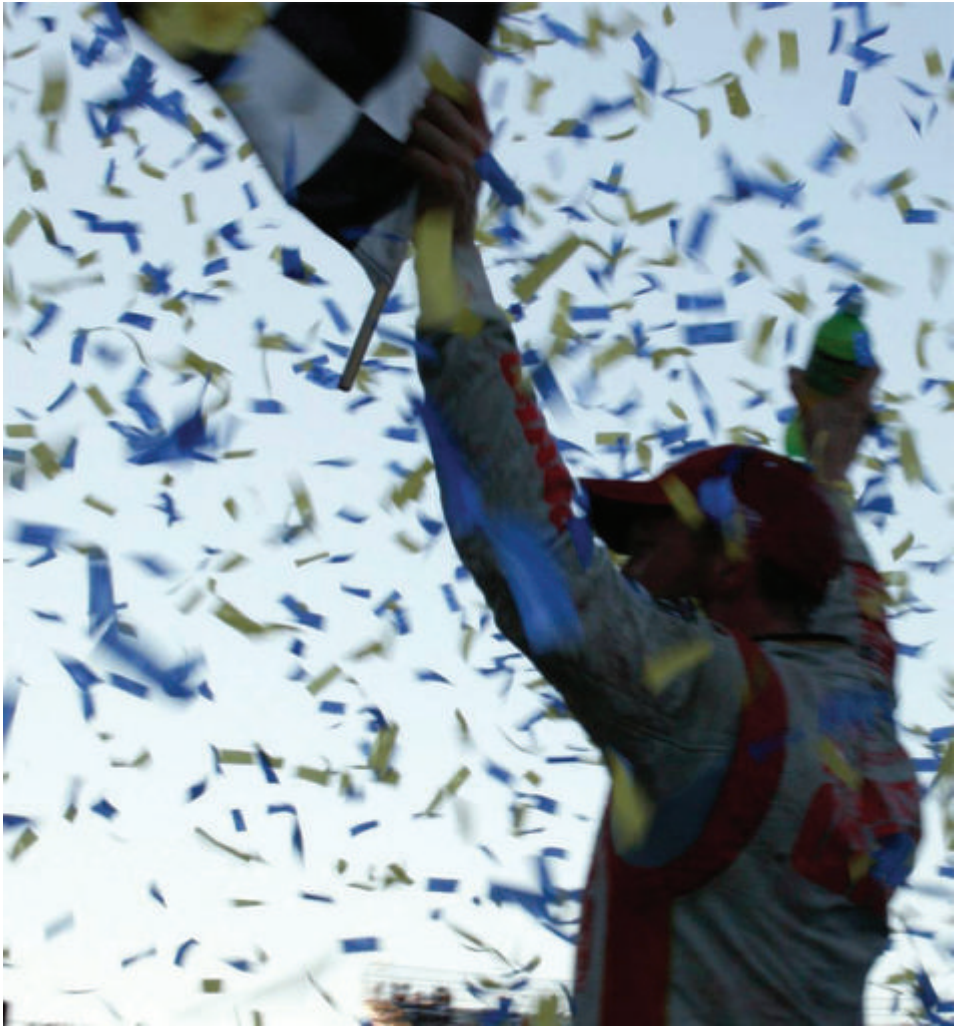
“The fall race weekend will be one of the most important ever held at Martinsville Speedway and we’re honored to host three races that will help determine the 2020 champions in all three of NASCAR’s national series,” said Campbell.



In addition to the pair of national series race weekends, Martinsville Speedway will once again host the ValleyStar Credit Union 300 on Saturday, Sept. 26th. The special event featuring the best weekly racers throughout the country is NASCAR’s biggest, richest and most prestigious Late Model Stock Car race and has been held under the lights since 2017.

“Fans showed us that they support night racing here during the last two ValleyStar Credit Union 300 weekends,” Campbell said. “This race has always given the fans a great show and we expect that to continue in September.”



Since 1994, Martinsville Uptown has strived to foster an environment in the Uptown central business district where entrepreneurs are cultivated, their businesses are promoted, assistance programs are offered and visitors are always welcome! For the past several years, Martinsville Uptown has worked with C-PEG and resided at the Chamber in an effort to combine forces to strengthen old businesses and develop new ones in Uptown.

1 The Uptown Martinsville Farmers' Market is open mid-April through mid-November, and during the 2019 season the market attracted 7,500 to 8,000 individuals! With over 40 market vendors, customers are sure to find a variety of items including beef, chicken, pork, eggs, baked goods, jams, jellies, homemade crafts, and produce, a wide variety at that!

Not to mention, the Uptown Martinsville Farmers' Market offers an electronic benefit transfer (EBT) match. Customers who receive funds through the Supplemental Nutrient Assistance Program (SNAP) are eligible to meet with the market manager and double their money! That's right, redeem money from an EBT card to spend on anything EBT eligible, and receive the same dollar amount to spend on produce! During the 2019 season, 138 people took advantage of this program, and over \$3,200 in EBT funds were distributed to SNAP participants!

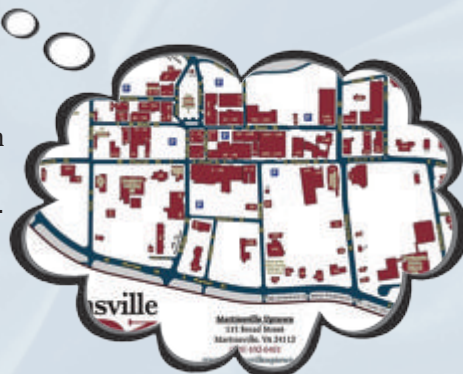

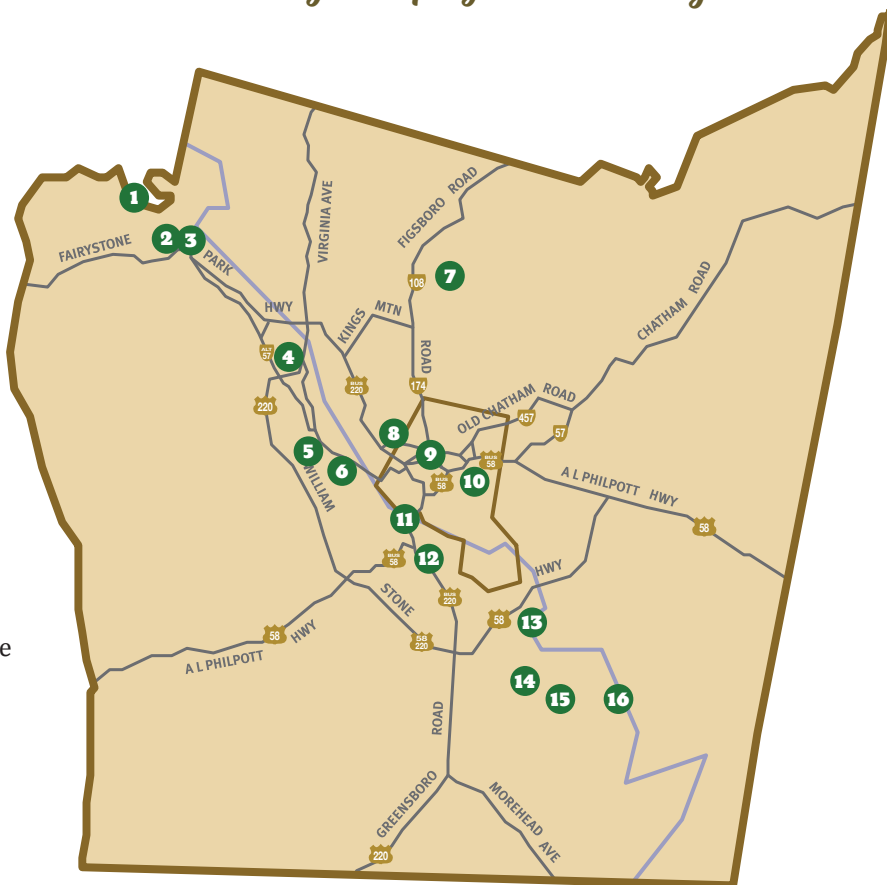

Smith River Sports Complex

The Complex Connection

On November 4, 2019 the Smith River Sports Complex (SRSC) became more accessible to residents of Martinsville-Henry County with the completion of the 2.5 mile extension of the Dick & Willie Trail from Spruce Street to SRSC. So many people are taking advantage of the newest way to arrive at the beautiful complex that the parking lot has had fewer cars than normal. Now guests or visitors walk, run or cycle on the new trail through quiet wooded nature along the scenic Smith River to arrive at SRSC. Lloyd Barber, executive director of SRSC and Martinsville resident, has already used the trail on multiple occasions to make the trip to and from work.

“I think the new section of the Dick & Willie Trail is by far the most beautiful,” Barber said. “The trail is a wonderful connector between the neighborhoods and the Smith River Sports Complex.”

Barber has certainly not been the only resident to use the trail since its grand opening. Over 50 guests attended the grand opening celebration on November 4 then walked the trail to capture the beauty it provides. Through studies from the Martinsville-Henry County Economic Development Corporation (EDC), over 550 guests accessed the trail in one week in November. It has also been recorded that the trail has seen as many as 200 visitors in one day since the opening, which is a very strong number despite November being a slower month for outdoor recreation activity due to the cooler temperatures.

“The Dick & Willie increases the quality of life for our locals,” said Sarah Hodges, director of tourism and talent development for the Martinsville-Henry County EDC. “[The trail] also enhances the experience for our visitors and generates economic development for Martinsville and Henry County.”

In 2019, SRSC brought in over 33,000 out-of-town visitors to Martinsville-Henry County. With the addition of the Dick & Willie Trail that number is only expected to grow even more. According to the Virginia Tourism Corporation, access to parks, water and trails are three of the top four recreation opportunities that Virginia residents ask for, which can all be found at SRSC.

“We’re an outdoor enthusiast’s or family’s dream for a perfect day outside,” Houston Stutz, SRSC Director of Operations, said. “We have a little bit of everything to offer our guests and residents in one world-class facility. We have access to the river for canoeing and kayaking, access to the trail to walk or bike, a driving range for golfing, high-quality fields for sports activity, a playground for the kids and picnic shelters to enjoy with family.”

Continuing to improve the Smith River Sports Complex by adding amenities such as the Dick & Willie Trail are not only beneficial for SRSC, but also the impact SRSC has on the community. In a recent economic impact study, it was shown SRSC brings more than \$5 million to the Martinsville-Henry County economy. In Virginia, outdoor recreation generates over \$21 billion in consumer spending annually and more than half of Virginia’s residents are reported to participate in outdoor

recreation, which means it’s important for SRSC to continue to operate as one of the state’s finest facilities to drive tourism and revenue into the community.

Since the creation of the trail passage, SRSC has already had two events take advantage of the trail. During the SRSC 10 Year Celebration participants were able to ride a bike along the trail to earn participation points for their respective teams and in December the complex was able to partner with Miles in Martinsville to host the “Light up the Night 5K” in a new location for the first time since the race began. Not only will the trail continue to open SRSC to more event opportunities in the future, but will also be a great amenity used to enhance existing events, such as Smith River Fest.

“When looking to sell SRSC and Martinsville to event operators the first question asked is, “What else do you have for families and participants to do?” Stutz said. “Now we have one more amenity to offer and what makes it even better is the guests do not even have to leave the facility to take advantage of it.”

With the addition of the Dick & Willie Trail, SRSC becomes more accessible to local residents, adds another amenity to drive sports and outdoor recreation tourism, plus opens SRSC up to more events while helping to maintain its position as one of the best facilities Virginia has to offer. Some may say it’s just another trail, but SRSC looks at it as a winning situation for the citizens of Martinsville-Henry County and the facility.

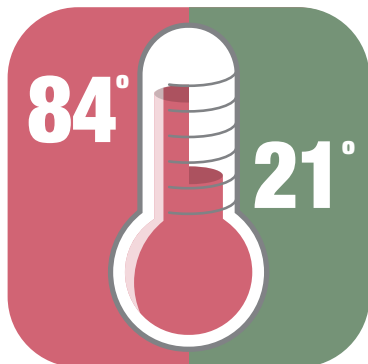

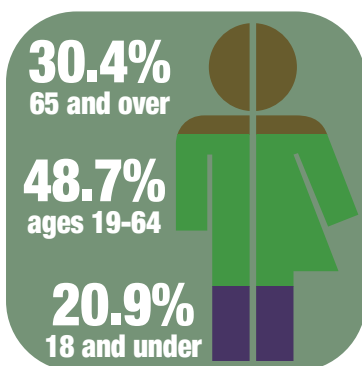

Move to Martinsville

This is Home

Why move to Martinsville? Ask different people, and you'll get different answers. But all of them have one thing in common: the community in southern Virginia offers a combination of opportunity, history, vision and quality of life that few others can match.

Lee Prillaman was looking for a place like the town he grew up in – which just happened to be Martinsville. Stephen Provost wanted to find a place where he and his wife could afford to live while they pursued careers as writers. Jim Roberts remembered growing up in the English countryside and envisioned a home that replicated that “bucolic setting of green fields separated by hedgerows and ancient trees with majestic leaf canopies.”

Prillaman came from Houston, Roberts from the nation's capital, and Provost from California. No one invited them to Martinsville, and each of them discovered – or rediscovered – the city in very different ways. Each of them were looking for something similar, and each of them found what they were looking for in Martinsville.

Prillaman found his way back to the city of his childhood after spending more than two decades in big cities like Houston and Dallas. The Prillaman name is prominent in the area, gracing businesses such as Prillaman & Pace – a plumbing, piping and air conditioning service company – and Prillaman's Market on Fayette Street.

A former partner in a major accounting firm, Prillaman came back to Martinsville and bought the Holt Building in Uptown, which he's renovating. When he decided to retire, he wanted a place to live with big-city convenience and small-town charm, and Martinsville came immediately to mind.

“We became very accustomed to most things – a trip to the grocery store, drive to airport, sporting events, etc. – being a 45- to 60-minute drive.”

His criteria also included a low cost of living, four distinct seasons and little to no traffic. Check, check and check.

Roberts, who came from Washington, D.C., had likewise become disenchanted with the “ever-increasing congestion and high costs” of big city life, so he and his wife, Julie, began to search for “a less hectic setting in which to semi-retire.”

They had looked around in several states by the time they came across a small magazine ad for a Tudor-style home in Henry County.

“After scheduling a visit, we discovered that the house capturing our attention was about as far away from metro Washington, D.C., as we could get,” he said. “We were enthralled already. Once south of Richmond, we found ourselves on roads we'd never traveled before. Every sight was new. And when we arrived at the house, we were delighted. It was as if an English manor home was plucked lock, stock and barrel from Britain and placed in Henry County.”

Provost and his wife had never been to Virginia and had never even heard of Martinsville. They'd lived most of their lives in California, but they needed a lower cost of living and were looking for beautiful surroundings to help inspire them. They looked to Virginia for its moderate climate, and began exploring the Highway 58 corridor, with an eye toward finding a new home.

Having scheduled tours with realtors all the way from the Tennessee state line to Norfolk, they ended their quest when they hit the halfway point in Martinsville. “It had everything we were looking for,” Provost said. “We could buy a home outright instead of paying more than \$2,000 a month in rent. The climate was mild, and the surroundings were gorgeous. We were amazed that the city was home to such a first-class facility as the Virginia Museum of Natural History, and we loved the fact that we could drive to Greensboro, Danville or Roanoke in an hour or less.

“The history of the area was a huge bonus,” he added. “As an author who's written several books on California's past, I found our new home so rich in history that I was immediately inspired to explore that history to write a book about it, *Martinsville Memories*.”

Then, there are the people.

“The crowning grace was being welcomed by our prospective neighbors; now good friends all,” said Roberts. “Henry County, and especially Martinsville – situated betwixt Greensboro and Roanoke, two larger cities that I can reach by car far faster than I can travel the same distance from D.C. to Baltimore – needs to be discovered.”

The Martinsville area has been through tough times. It had to reinvent itself in the early 20th century, when the thriving tobacco industry of the late 19th century went into decline. Entrepreneurs responded by transforming it into the world leader in textile and furniture production.

When many of those factory jobs were lost overseas a century later, Martinsville was challenged to reinvent itself again. And it's more than rising to the challenge.

Said Prillaman: “Many people that live here don't see it – they may be a little too close to it – but if you give the area an objective look, consider the job growth, the available investment opportunities and the location of Martinsville in relation to Roanoke and the (North Carolina) Triad, I think you would conclude that Martinsville/Henry County's finest days are ahead of it, and we are thrilled to be here to be part of this chapter of Martinsville's history.”

Another challenge is letting people know about Martinsville. Prillaman already knew about the town, having grown up here. But Roberts and Provost both stumbled upon it almost by accident.

The idea behind a new initiative called Move to Martinsville is to get the word out about just how much the city has to offer as a place to live.

People interested in working remotely, raising families or retiring in an environment rich in natural beauty and history will find Martinsville the perfect landing spot. Organizers behind Move to Martinsville want to help people find Martinsville on purpose, instead of by happy accident. There's so much here to like, there's no reason to keep it a secret.

Roberts summed it up: “The affordable homes, lack of congestion, low costs, traditional values, welcoming residents, outdoor recreation choices, uniquely American bluegrass music heritage, NASCAR Speedway, even the entrepreneur-ready empty buildings available for repurposing, and more are strong enticements for anyone seeking a richer life to relocate to Henry County.”

Lending A Helping Hand

She may have been born at RAF Upper Heyford in Oxfordshire, England and worked for a time in North Carolina but Latala Hodges calls Axton, Virginia, and Martinsville - Henry County home. Her love for “home” is tremendous as she gives much of her spare time lending a helping hand to area non-profits. Latala learned the value of hard work and giving from her parents and grandparents. After graduating Martinsville High School, Patrick Henry Community College and Virginia Commonwealth University, she worked for Rockingham County Newsgroup in Reidsville, NC. She said, “It was there that I really started to develop an interest in volunteering. I got to cover so many wonderful stories about the community and the people who came together to make it better. I wrote stories about everyday people who became heroes to others because they helped them graduate high school, go to college, find childcare, or where to receive a hot meal”.

After being hired at Patrick Henry Community College she dove right in and took every opportunity she could to seek out programs in which she could have an impact. Now in her role at The Harvest Foundation, she has been able to continue her interest in volunteering and gets to see how those programs are built from the ground up. You never know where you might see Latala offering a helping hand. It could be at the Dan W. Prince, III Thanksgiving Dinner hosted by The Harvest Youth Board, cleaning rivers and trails with the Dan River Basin Association, tending a rest stop at the Chamber’s Education Foundation – Tour de Scholar, volunteering at Oktoberfest with Martinsville Uptown, caring for animals at Infinity Acres, and the list goes on and on. Latala says, “If I could become a full-time volunteer, I would probably jump at it in a heartbeat. However, I love my job”.

Q Your dedication to Martinsville and Henry County is clear in the time you give throughout the community. What motivates you to volunteer and share in the capacity you do?

A Martinsville-Henry County is home to some of the most generous people I've ever met in my entire life. I know a few of them who will quite literally take the shirt off their backs and give it to someone in need. It's important for me to give back to my community that's given so much to me over the years. I wouldn't be here if it weren't for my teachers, neighbors, family, and friends who supported me when I needed it. It's about me paying it forward, but it's also about being there for someone when they truly need it. I know how that feels and to make that happen for another person or family is special and important to me.

Q What is your greatest strength and how does that help you as a volunteer?

A It's my greatest strength, but it's also what some people say is most annoying about me – I love to talk. Talking helps me connect to people, and building meaningful relationships helps me be a better person and a better volunteer. Volunteering can be tough whether you're doing it on your own or with a group. Sometimes the work is hard and you can get discouraged. It's important to remind ourselves why we're there and how we're helping our community.

Q Volunteerism and leadership are correlated. Do you agree or disagree, and why?

A I wholly agree with that statement. I see volunteering as a form of leadership because of the skills it takes to be a good volunteer. Whether you're part of a team, leading one, or doing it on your own, you have to take initiative to get the job done and be a source of strength and motivation. You have to set out with a clear vision and follow that vision to achieve your goals. Volunteering teaches you lessons that are hard to come by in traditional jobs or careers.

Q Do you feel like volunteering has impacted your career and how?

A Indirectly, I do feel like volunteering has impacted my career by helping me become a better person. I'm better equipped to deal with certain situations because I know how hard people fight for things that I have taken for granted time and time again. I'm more compassionate, more empathetic and I take time to truly listen when I have conversations. All of those important life skills have come from volunteering.

Q Why is volunteering important to the Martinsville and Henry County community?

A Our community has a lot of need. While many people are somewhat removed from seeing those needs, that doesn't mean they go away. Writing a check is amazing, and we need more of that, but the need goes beyond money. Many nonprofits and programs need that check and they also need manpower to accomplish their goals. Resources are tight, and many of those resources are used to simply keep the lights on. If more nonprofits had a dedicated and hardworking volunteer base, that would help them tremendously in making our community a better place.

Q What advice would you give to young professionals regarding volunteerism?

A You have to make time for it. Yes, we're all busy. I'm not always there when I need to be or even when I want to be, but I carve out time for what's important to me. There will never be enough time to accomplish everything you want. I prioritize and make it a point to share what I'm doing with my family, friends, and neighbors. I hope if I can relay how wonderful my experiences are, they will join me the next time I have a volunteer gig.

Working Together

From new business to collaborations, Startup M-HC continues to flourish. To date, over \$215,000 cash and in-kind grants have been awarded, as well as, priceless business contacts made.

In 2019, the Chamber's Partnership for Economic Growth (C-PEG) gave awards totaling \$32,460 to four startup businesses. Twenty-two area entrepreneurs completed the Startup Martinsville and Henry County classes and better positioned themselves to open or expand their business.

Award recipients for 2019 included:

- Chris Lawless – Lawless Welding & Fabrications, Inc., \$13,690
- David & Rebecca Watson – Gotcha Covered Linens & Party Rentals, \$3,190
- Richard Reed – Reed Electrical Solutions, LLC, \$9,890
- Hunter Shively & Jeffrey Hairston - Sole Zone VA, \$5,690

The past year found great collaborative work between past Startup M-HC award winners. Examples of this work include the new sign at Cocoa Trail Chocolates fabricated by Lawless Welding & Fabrications and decorations and a balloon arch from Gotcha Covered Linens & Party Rentals at Red & Mae's grand opening.

Since the program's inception, awardees have created over \$1 million in new capital investment and 113 new jobs.

C-PEG partners with Patrick Henry Community College (PHCC) to deliver an eight-week entrepreneurial boot-camp to equip individuals with "an entrepreneurial mindset". The boot-camp is taught by serial entrepreneur Dr. Angeline Godwin, who says "this mindset is a necessity for successfully starting and sustaining a business."



Funding and support for the program came from the City of Martinsville, Henry County, The Campbell Family Foundation and George W. Lester, II. Corporate sponsor of the program was American National Bank, and Grow sponsor (a four-week boot-camp for growing businesses) is Appalachian Power.

C-PEG is contracted by the City of Martinsville to administer small business and entrepreneurial development, and Henry County contracts C-PEG to provide entrepreneurial and retail development.

C-PEG is the Martinsville-Henry County Chamber of Commerce's charitable affiliate.

Chamber Honors Small Business and Individuals

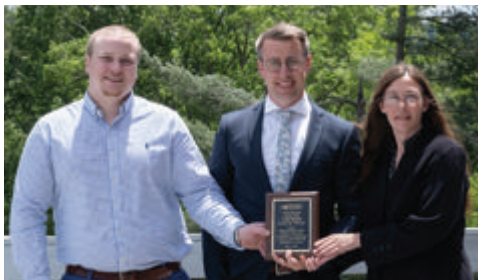

Open and Ready for Business

Commonwealth Crossing

Nestled along the U.S. Route 220 Highway straddling the Virginia/North Carolina state line is Commonwealth Crossing. This premier industrial park serves as a statement for the community -- Martinsville-Henry County is open and ready for business.

Located at the park now are the Commonwealth Center for Advanced Training (CCAT) and Press Glass, a Poland-based company that is the largest independent, flat glass processing operation in Europe. While the official grand opening at CCAT was held in October 2019, officials at Press Glass have enjoyed a jump start on operations by utilizing available office space at the facility.

The 25,889 square-foot, \$6.5 million building

boasts advanced manufacturing training facilities and a high-bay area as well as office space dedicated to companies locating in the industrial park. Companies can use the space for pre-employment screenings and services, train using their own equipment, and work during the build-out of their facility.

CCAT is a partnership of the Martinsville-Henry County EDC, which owns the building with the Henry County Industrial Development Authority (IDA), Patrick Henry Community College, which will conduct workforce training at the facility, Henry County, and The Harvest Foundation, providing a \$5 million grant for the project.

Press Glass plans to open its new 280,000 square-foot building in March or April of 2020 and will

leave CCAT for the next company to move in and utilize. Company officials in July 2018 announced their intent to invest \$43.55 million in the facility, which will create 212 jobs. Since its announcement Press Glass' investment has grown to \$53.55 million.

"From this location, the new production facility enables Press Glass to enter a targeted sales territory and market segment," said Press Glass Vice President Michael Lankford at the time of the initial announcement.

"There are many reasons for selecting Henry County and Commonwealth Crossing. The location of the industrial park is near our existing production facility in Stoneville, North Carolina, which will enable synergy between the two facilities, allowing them to share knowledge, resources, and management. Building a formidable team will be paramount in the success of the operation, and we feel we can build such a team in this area. Working with Martinsville-Henry County Economic Development and the Commonwealth of Virginia reaffirmed this decision. Press Glass is looking forward to a successful future and working closely with the community."

Press Glass held two "Meet 'n' Greet" opportunities for prospective employees at the CCAT facility in September 2019. It was standing room only as hundreds of people filled the training room during both sessions. Equipment is in the process of being installed while positions still are being filled. To find out more about working at Press Glass, visit www.pressglass.us.

Commonwealth Crossing features two fully graded, shovel-ready pads. Tract 1 is 65 pad acres, expandable up to 145 total acres. The tract has access to full utilities and is adjacent to the Norfolk Southern Railway mainline, connected by a dedicated spur. Tract 4 is 55 pad acres with full utilities. A third tract is available for future development. More information on Commonwealth Crossing is available at www.commonwealthcrossing.com.

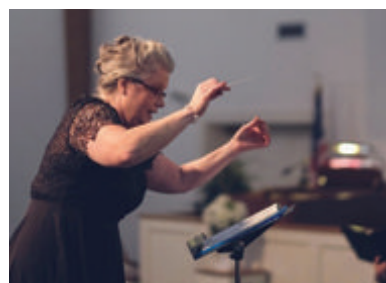
